WHAT IS THE MEANING OF LIFE?


The *Boy on the Page* tackles the meaning of life in a joyful way. In the story, the boy discovers that for him the meaning of life is **to love and be loved**.

Do you agree with him?


Write or draw what you think is the meaning of life.






