## SPECIAL ROUND 2016 - 2017 EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

CLOSING 4PM FRIDAY, 30 JUNE 2017

Local groups or individuals with short-term arts and cultural projects starting after **6 September 2017**, are invited to submit an Expression Of Interest (EOI) for the Special Round July 2017. Those who submit an EOI are eligible for mentoring assistance with a Committee Member in the development of their application.

## APPLICATIONS

CLOSING 4PM FRIDAY, 28 JULY 2017

Submissions are assessed by a local committee of dedicated arts and community representatives, who make recommendations for funding to Council. Applications can be made across a variety of artforms with six funding categories available and four local priorities identified.

The Gladstone Region Regional Arts Development Fund is a Queensland Government and Gladstone Regional Council partnership program to support local arts and culture in regional Queensland.



# GLADSTONE REGION REGIONAL ARTS DEVELOPMENT FUND (RADF)

## FUNDING CATEGORIES

### 1. Developing Regional Skills

For individual professional artists and artswomen living in regional Queensland to attend professional development seminars or activities; master classes; mentorships or placements.

### 2. Building Community Cultural Capacity

For community groups to engage a professional artist or artswoman to work with them on developing their arts practice or to run arts development workshops or community projects.

### 3. Regional Partnerships

To encourage innovative and energising arts and cultural projects where artists, communities and Councils work together in their community, or in partnership with another community.

### 4. Cultural Tourism

For projects and activities that focus on communities' locally distinct arts, culture and heritage both for members of that community and for visitors.

### 5. Concept Development

To develop arts and cultural research ideas and project proposals to the implementation stage and identify funding sources outside of RADF to implement project proposals.

### 6. Contemporary Collections/Stories

To preserve and provide access to locally held collections of significance, and collect and tell local stories from the past and the present that can demonstrate state and/or local significance.
