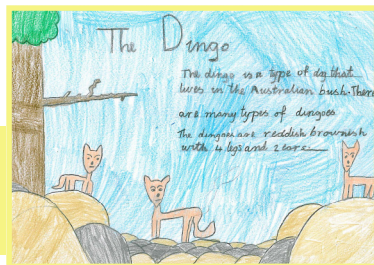

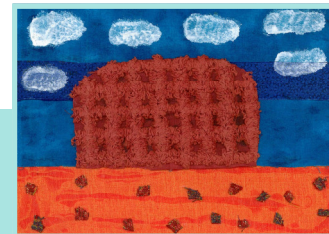

I used a 29cm orange strip of fabric, 6cm high with red and blue fabric squares. On top of the orange strip I put a blue piece of fabric overlapping the orange strip (29cm long, 5.5cm high). Then overlapping that piece I got a very dark blue piece of fabric and pasted it on top of another piece of fabric that is also blue. Next I cut out a brown fluffy Uluru and put it just above the orange strip. Finally I got some white paint and a reasonably clean brush to dab on five or six clouds on the upper fabric pieces.

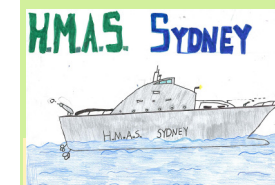
