## Daniel Boyd (Australia)

History is made at night 2012

Daniel Boyd uses the 'dot' as a lens for viewing the world. For Kids' APT7 on Tour, Boyd has created a multimedia interactive that allows players to reveal information about a hidden image via screens of dots.

### Parastou Forouhar (Iran/Germany)

Persian for kids 2012

Parastou Forouhar presents an activity for children and families that uses the script of the Farsi language. Children are invited to create their own zoomorphic image — an animal form shaped from Farsi lettering.

## Uji Handoko Eko Saputro (aka Hahan) (Indonesia)

Memento masko 2012

Inspired by mask-making traditions from Indonesia, Hahan has created a series of black-and-white masks for children to complete by drawing their own facial expressions.

#### Roslisham Ismail (aka Ise) (Malaysia)

Sira pisang (Glazed banana) 2012

For Kids' APT7 on Tour, children can illustrate their favourite meal on a specially designed placemat. Children will also receive a traditional Malaysian recipe, beautifully illustrated by the artist, which they can then cook and share at home.

#### Tromarama (Indonesia)

Wattt?! 2010

The imaginary after-dark activities of lamps take centrestage in the playful film *Wattt?!*. Set in a typical living room, a desk lamp is supported by a cast of coloured lights in this fun stop-motion animation.
