

Sadly due to events out of their control this meeting never came to fruition, however upon returning to Gladstone Beryl and Leanne decided to combine their two unique styles of painting for a joint exhibition of all the people and places they saw while on their travels aboard.

"Leanne and I have been friends for some fifteen years and I always enjoy working with her. Whilst we have very different styles of painting, I know that we both respect each other's work." Beryl stated.

Beryl first picked up a paintbrush at the age of fifty, while Leanne has been practicing her art since around the age of ten.

"I first met Beryl in Helen Mangan's Art class many years ago. Since then we have painted buses together, shared 'Sunfest' activities and had a joint exhibition in Biloela. Our art is very different and we always laugh about the fact that Beryl loves things asymmetrical whereas I have to have things symmetrical. We are the best of friends and I love her to bits." Leanne said.

Their newest project 'Gladstone Girls Go AWOL' showcases fifty artworks by the women as well as other knickknacks, souvenirs and photos from their 2013 European travels.

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A word from Beryl Wood

Leanne and I have been friends for some 15 years and I always enjoy working with her, some of our many activities include painting buses for 'Sunfest,' decorating the Council truck for the street parade and a joint exhibition in Biloela. Whilst we have very different styles of painting I know that we both respect each other's work as just being different.

Since I started painting twenty years ago I have been fortunate to have exhibited in Gladstone, Brisbane and Sydney. My greatest achievement (that sounds a bit pompous!) is being awarded the overall in the Rio Tinto Alcan Martin Hanson Memorial Art Awards in 2008 and of the acquisition of an artists book for the James Hardy collection of the Queensland State Library.
