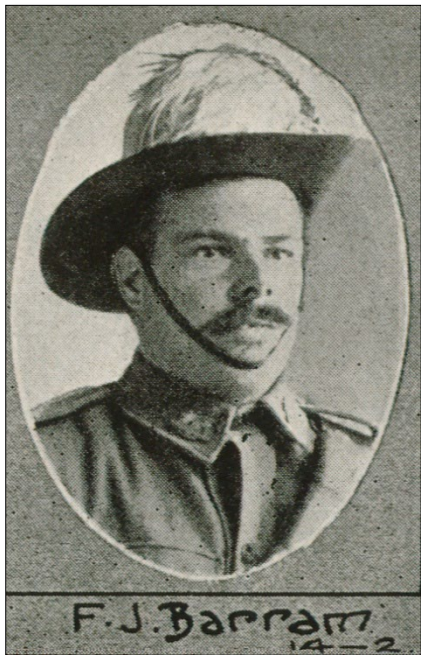


BARRAM, Frank James (Bauam on Honour Roll)

Service Number: 2012

Unit: 2nd Light Horse Regiment, 14th Reinforcement/3rd Field Artillery Brigade.

Place of Birth: Ipswich, Queensland

Date of Birth: 2 February, 1885.

Enlisted at: Mount Larcom, via Gladstone, Queensland, on 19 August 1915 aged 30 years 7 months.

Next-of-kin was brother, William Lewis Barram, Ripley, via Ipswich, Qld.

On enlistment he was 5 ft 8 inches and weighed 170 lbs. His chest measurement was 36-38 inches. His occupation was labourer. Address Mt Larcom, Queensland. Unit embarked from Brisbane, Queensland, on board HMAT A62 *Wandilla* on 31 January 1916. Taken on strength 1st Light Horse Regiment at Heliopolis 7 March 1916. Admitted to hospital Heliopolis with mumps 22 March 1916. Returned to duty Tel-el-Kabir 20 April 1916. Transferred to Artillery details 15 May 1916 to Alexandria. Sent to Marseilles, France 5 June 1916. Leave to Paris 6 August 1918. Rejoined from leave 21 August 1918. Appointed Shoeing Smith 25 August 1918. Leave to UK 8

September 1918. Returned from leave 27 September 1918. Returned to Australia 20 April 1919.

Brothers: 2098 Driver Cecil BARRAM, 5th Field Artillery Brigade, returned to Australia, 29 November 1919; 15520 Pte Frederick Charles BARRAM, Australian Army Service Corps, returned to Australia 20 April 1919.

Medals: British War Medal; Victory Medal
