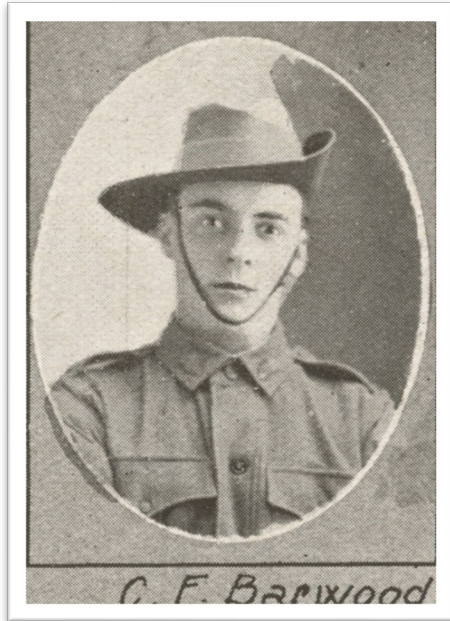


## BARWOOD, Charles Frederick

Place of Birth: Walthamstow, Essex, London, England

Date of Birth: Oct-Dec, 1895. (GRO, England registration - WEST HAM Volume 04A Page 377)

Enlisted at Brisbane 8 May 1915, aged 22 yrs 5 months. Next-of-kin was his father, Thomas Robert Barwood, 49 Somerset Rd, Walthamstow, London, Essex, England. On enlistment he was 5 feet 8.5 inches and weighed 147 lbs. His chest measurement was 34-36 inches. His occupation was market gardener. He served in Alexandria and Lemnos, then France. He was wounded in France, gunshot wound to left shoulder on 7 August 1916. He also accidentally fractured his ankle while walking in the dark in October 1917.

He returned to Australia on 1 August 1919.
