
## CHAMBERS, Frederick Roy (believed to also be known as Clinton Roy MYERS)

Place of Birth: Walkerville, Canada

Date of Birth: c. 1889 (Son of William H. and Lillian Myers, Fostoria, Michigan, USA) Enlisted at Gladstone, Queensland, on 19 August 1915 aged 26 years 3 months.

Next-of-kin was Uncle John Sears, Minnewaukan, North Dakota, USA

On enlistment he was 5 ft 10.5 inches and weighed 144 lbs. His chest measurement was 35-37 inches. His occupation was mechanic. Was an apprentice for 2 years at Buick Motor Company. Unit embarked from Brisbane, Qld, on board HMAT A26 *Armadale* on 18 September 1915. Disembarked Marseilles, France 19 March 1916. In hospitals from April to late July. Reported missing in action 5 August 1916. Amended. Killed in action, France, 5 August 1916. Commemorated at Villers-Brettoneux, France.
