Enlisted at Rockhampton 6 November 1915 age 27 years 5 months. Next-of-kin was unknown. On enlistment he was 5 feet 6 inches and weighed 11 stone 3 lbs. His chest measurement was 39 inches. His occupation was fireman (marine). Deckhardt proceeded overseas to France on 25 November 1916. He was admitted to hospital on 5 March 1917 with a septic foot and discharged to duty on 9 March 1917. He was promoted to Lance Corporal on 5 August 1917 and was killed in action in the field in Belgium on 12 October 1917. Deckhardt is commemorated at Menin Gate, Ypres, Belgium.

On a previous enlistment form in Moss Vale, New South Wales, Deckhardt named his brother, John Deckhardt, of Cholm, Russian Poland, as next-of-kin.
