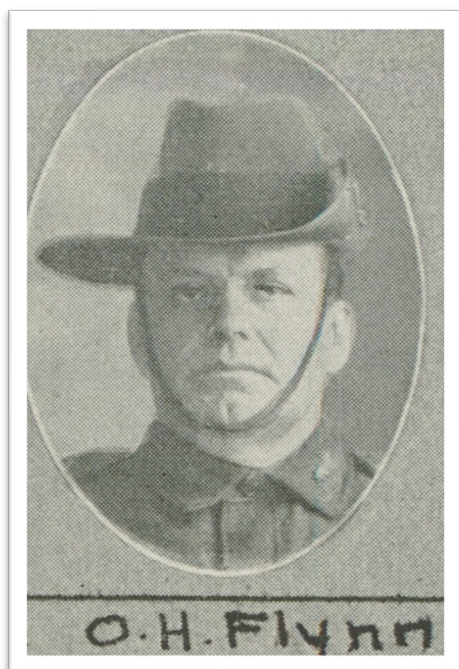
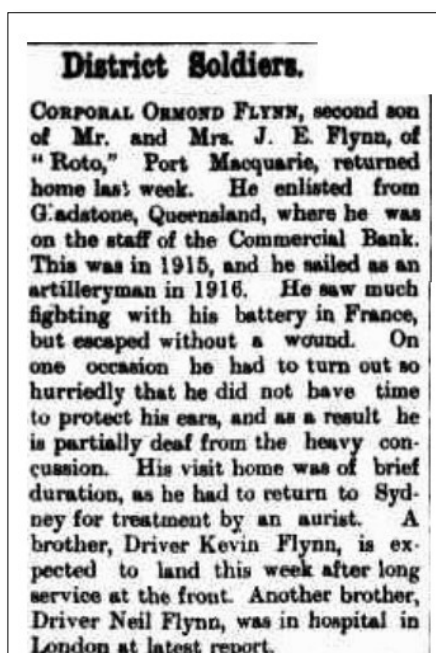

Enlisted at Rockhampton Qld, 29 July 1915 age 25 years 11 months. Next-of-kin was his mother, Mrs Jessie Louisa Flynn, Roto, Port Macquarie, NSW. On enlistment he was 6 feet 2 inches and weighed 175 lbs. His chest measurement was 35-37.5 inches. His occupation was bank clerk (accountant) in the Commercial Bank, Gladstone. He embarked to England on 11 May 1916 and was taken on strength of 3rd DAC on 2 October 1916. He proceeded to France on 25 November 1916. Flynn was wounded in action with GSW to left shoulder on 11 July 1918 in France and was invalided to Beaufort War Hospital, England on 26 July 1918. He returned to action on 10 December 1918. Flynn returned to Australia on 29 May 1919 and was discharged on 15 September 1919.
