Enlisted twice – firstly at Gladstone, age 18 years 0 months, was discharged due to debility, then re-enlisted at Mount Morgan, age 18 years 1 month.

Next-of-kin was his father Andrew Graham, Mount Morgan, then his mother, Margaret Graham, Racecourse Road, Mount Morgan.

On enlistment he was 5 feet 10 inches and weighed 136 lbs. His chest measurement was 32-34 inches. His occupation was labourer. He had been an apprentice to the cook at Imperial Hotel, Mount Morgan.

Served in Gallipoli. Suffered from diarrhoea in July 1915. Then claimed wounded in foot in September 1915. Report of wound was not accepted (see service record). Discharged 1 December 1915 after being diagnosed with Pulmonary Tuberculosis.
