Enlisted at Gladstone, on 11 April 1916 aged 19 years 7 months. Next-of-kin was his mother, Harriet Hay, Barmundu, Boyne Valley Line, Qld. On enlistment he was 5 feet 8 inches and weighed 10 stone 4 lbs. His chest measurement was 37.5 inches. His occupation was Stockman. Served in France. Unit embarked from Brisbane, Queensland, on board HMAT A49 *Seang Choon* on 19 September 1916. Wounded in action (GSW right leg) 26 September 1917 and admitted to hospital 10 October 1917. Returned to unit 14 February 1918. Died of wounds (Shell wound right shoulder) received in action 10 August 1918. Buried Vignacourt British Cemetery, 8 miles NNW of Amiens, Picardie, France. Plot 6, Row A, Grave 2.
