Date of Birth: 9 September 1886

Enlisted at Rockhampton, on 1 March 1917 aged 30 years 5 months. Next-of-kin was his mother, Emma Hulme, Calliope, Boyne Valley Line, Qld. On enlistment he was 5 feet 11.5 inches and weighed 176 lbs. His chest measurement was 38 inches. His occupation was sheep overseer. Embarked overseas 11 May 1917. Served in France. Wounded in action (GSW left arm) in France 19 April 1918. Invalided to UK. Returned to Unit 8 August 1918. Wounded in action, second occasion, GSW back near sacrum above buttock, 25 August 1918. Invalided to UK. Operation performed. Bullet (FB – foreign body) still in situ. Returned to Australia from England on 2 January 1919. Died 19 January 1947.
