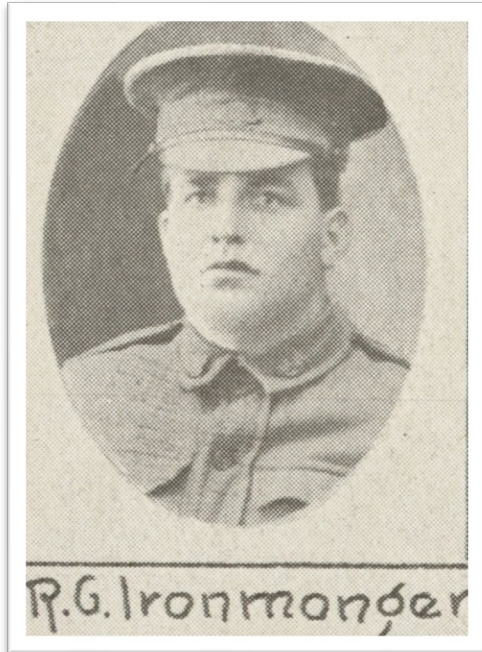


IRONMONGER, Robert George

Date of Birth: 9 May 1892

Enlisted at Rockhampton, Qld, after recruiting in Gladstone on 11 October 1916 aged 24 years 4 months. Next-of-kin was father, William Ironmonger. On enlistment he was 5 feet 8.75 inches and weighed 172 lbs. Chest measurement was 39/41 inches. His occupation was labourer. Enlisted on same date as his brother, Thomas Ironmonger. He embarked on 17 November 1916, landing at Plymouth, England. Served in France arriving there in July 1917. He was wounded in action on 4 October 1917, and admitted to hospital in England with GSW to left forearm on 14 October 1917. Returned to Australia 1 February 1918.
