## **JONES, Adolphus William Percy**



Lieutenant A. W. P. Jones, D.C.M., Who received his commission, the Distinguished conduct Medal, and the thanks of the general commanding the army on the British front for conspicuous gallanty in the battle of Riencourt, April 11, 1917, Lieutenant Jones was born in Brisbane, Queensland, and is only 20 years of age. He is the son of Mr. A. P. Jones, general secretary of the Liberal Association of Queensland.

Enlisted at Rockhampton Qld, on 7 February 1916 aged 19 years 1 month.

Next-of-kin was his father, Adolphus Percy Jones, Zillmere, Brisbane, Qld. On enlistment he was 5 feet 6 inches and weighed 9 stone 0 lbs. His chest measurement was 34.5 inches. His occupation was bank clerk, Australian Bank of Commerce, Gladstone, Qld. Previously served in Citizen Forces for 18 months. Served in France and Belgium. Killed in action 24 September 1917 at Westhoek, Flanders, Belgium, aged 20 years 11 months. Commemorated Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Panel 17, Belgium.

Medals: Awarded DCM Distinguished Conduct Medal: 'For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He directed his machine gun team through the enemy's wire under very heavy fire. He rendered invaluable service throughout the operations.' Source: 'Commonwealth Gazette, No. 169, 4 October 1917'.
