On enlistment he was 6 feet 0 inches and weighed 148 lbs. His chest measurement was 34.5-38.5 inches. His occupation was labourer/miner. He served in France after arriving 18 August 1917. Contracted mumps 26 January 1918. Hospital, followed by a relapse. Returned to Australia 25 October 1919. Discharged 4 December 1919. Died 1 January 1963 in Calliope and buried at Calliope Cemetery.
