GSW to buttock. Rejoined battalion on 18 Dec 1916. Awarded Military Medal 1917. Sick – cardiac dilatation. Premature senility. Returned to Australia 10 March 1918. Discharged 18 June 1918.

Medals: 'During operations East of YPRES, between 20th and 27th September 1917. A/Sergeant MOBERLY has been in charge of Infantry parties engaged on various road works. He has always exhibited remarkable coolness under continuous shell fire, and carried out his duties most assiduously, with complete disregard for his personal safety, and has done his utmost to keep his men up to the work, and to push the job through successfully.'
