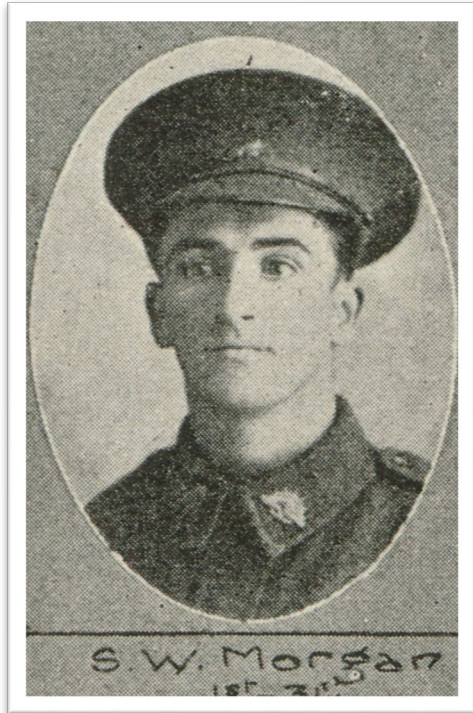


MORGAN, Sydney White

Date of Birth: 5 June 1897

Enlisted at Brisbane, Qld, on 21 July 1915, aged 18 years 1 mth. Next-of-kin was father, Mr Thomas Henry Morgan, Gladstone, Queensland. (Mother Lillian Jane White). On enlistment he was 5 feet 2.25 inches and weighed 106 lbs. His chest measurement was 32-34 inches. His occupation was salesman. He served in France. Wounded in action 20 July 1916 GSW to ankle. Wounded (gassed) 17 February 1917, DAH (Disordered action of heart). Admitted hospital Stourbridge. Returned to Australia 27 July 1917. Discharged 31 October 1917.
