Enlisted at Gladstone, Queensland, on 22 March 1915, aged 23 years 10 months.

Next-of-kin was father, William John Rhodes, Littlemore, Boyne Valley line, near Gladstone, Qld.

On enlistment he was 6ft 2 inches and weighed 165 lbs. His chest measurement was 34-36 inches. His occupation was stockman, Littlemore, Boyne Valley line, via Gladstone, Qld. Unit embarked from Brisbane, Qld, on board HMAT A55 *Kyarra* on 10 August 1915. Disembarked. Wounded at Villers-Brettonneux and invalided home. Returned to Australia 27 August 1917. Lived Gladstone, Qld, married Ellen Vallis, and moved to Monto Qld. Formed a 5th Light Horse Troop in 1936. Enlisted WW2 as Captain – SERN Q5161; took over 3rd Mobile Recruiting Unit. Later discharged due to ill health. Died 1975.
