On enlistment he was 5ft 6 inches and weighed 11 stone 8 lbs. His chest measurement was 37.5-39.5 inches. His occupation was carpenter, Benaraby via Gladstone, Qld. Was a member of Port Curtis Infantry 10 years/15th Light Horse. Quarter master and Hon Lieutenant. Promoted to corporal 10 November 1914. Unit embarked from Sydney, New South Wales, on board SS *Eastern* on 28 December 1914 to Rabaul. Numerous furloughs to Australia throughout service. Went to Kokopo and Duke of York Islands from Rabaul and back again.

Discharged 31 July 1920 at Rabaul. Died 19 November 1946. Funeral notice Wed 20 November 1946 *Courier Mail*. Living at Kilcoy, Qld.
