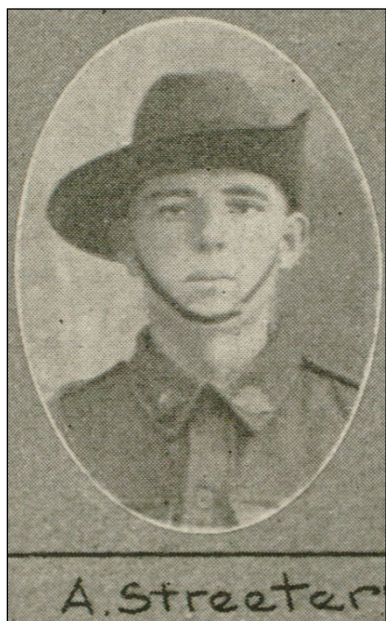


## STREETER, Albert Charles Sherrington

Place of Birth: Monal, Queensland.

Date of Birth: 10 February 1899

Enlisted at Brisbane, Qld on 23 March 1916, aged 21 years 1 month. Next-of-kin was father, William Streeter, Colosseum (North Coast line), Queensland. (Mother Margaret Sherrington). Address later: Fairy Springs, via Calliope, Qld)

On enlistment he was 5 ft 6 inches and weighed 131 lbs. His chest measurement was 31.5-36.5 inches. His occupation was dairy hand. Unit embarked from Brisbane, Queensland, on board HMAT A42 *Boorara* on 16 August 1916. Proceeding overseas to France on 28 December 1916. Wounded in action in France 6 November 1917. Embarked for hospital, England (shell gas poisoning) 14 November 1917. Proceeded overseas to France 17 April 1918.

Returned to Australia 15 May 1919. Discharged 21 August 1919. Died 3 June 1970 aged 71 years.
