Enlisted at Gladstone, Queensland on 19 December 1914, aged 19 years 4 months. Next-of-kin was mother, Mrs Elizabeth Dare, Ambrose Siding, Queensland.

On enlistment he was 5 ft 6 inches and weighed 144 lbs. His chest measurement was 34-36 inches. His occupation was stockman, living at Ambrose Siding, Queensland. Unit embarked from Newcastle on board HMAT A57 *Malakuta* on 17 May 1915. Joined unit in Gallipoli 28 August 1915. Dysentery/Enteric Fever - to St Andrews Hospital Malta 18 September 1915. Taken on strength 2<sup>nd</sup> LHR Tel-el-Kebir 18 April 1916. Transferred to 5<sup>th</sup> LHR 30 April 1916. Marched out to Egypt March 1917. Admitted hospital Ismalia German Measles 5 May 1917. Transferred to 5<sup>th</sup> Light Horse Reg't 1 July 1917. Suffered malaria 21 September 1918. Then returned to duty in Moasca and Suez. Returned to Australia 28 June 1919.

Died 12 December 1968.
