Next-of-kin was mother, Annie Harriet WILLATON, Piggoreet via Ballarat, Victoria.

On enlistment he was 5 ft 7.75 inches and weighed 10 stone 6 lbs. His chest measurement was 35.5 inches. His occupation was school teacher, living at Littlemore, Boyne Valley, via Gladstone, Queensland. Unit embarked from Sydney, New South Wales, on board RMS *Osterley* on 10 February 1917. France 14 August 1917. Admitted hospital Chatham England gastritis 24 January 1918. Sick to Sutton Veney Hospital England 19 July 1918. Admitted for mental observation. Returned to Australia 3 March 1919. Married Alicia Adelaide Mossman, 23 January 1922. Died 4 August 1931.
